McSHANE'S BLOCK SHIRAZ 2001

The original Jamiesons Run was a remote outback sheep station owned by the Jamieson Brothers in the mid 1800's. This wine is sourced from grapes grown on the famous McShane's vineyard located in the heart of the Coonawarra region, in the South East of South Australia.

The 2001 Jamiesons Run McShane's Block Shiraz is deep red with purple hues in the glass. This medium bodied wine show dark plum, blackberry, warm earth and spicy oak aromas and flavours with hints of eucalypt and mint. Supple silky tannins form the basis of this finely structured, balanced Shiraz.

VITICULTURE

This limited parcel of wine was sourced from grapes grown on the McShane's vineyard located in the heart of South Australia's Coonawarra region. The warm 2001 vintage in the Coonawarra produced a long ripening season. The cool, clear nights helped to retain distinctive cool climate Shiraz character, intense flavour and an elegant palate structure, both firm and supple.

WINEMAKING

After crushing and de-stemming, parcels from the McShane's vineyard were fermented in small rotary fermenters and pressed to barrel to complete fermentation in new French and American oak barriques, with a portion allocated to seasoned oak barrels. After 24 months barrel maturation the wine was blended and bottled.

SUGGESTED FOOD

Beef Bourguignon served with small boiled potatoes topped with freshly chopped parsley and steamed baby carrots.

CELLARING

The 2001 Jamiesons Run McShane's Block Shiraz is an elegant cool climate Shiraz style from Coonawarra and will reward careful cellaring potential for 5 to 10 years.
